Helps students identify their natural tendencies. They gain confidence and greater self awareness to help them make better decisions and take advantage of their strengths.



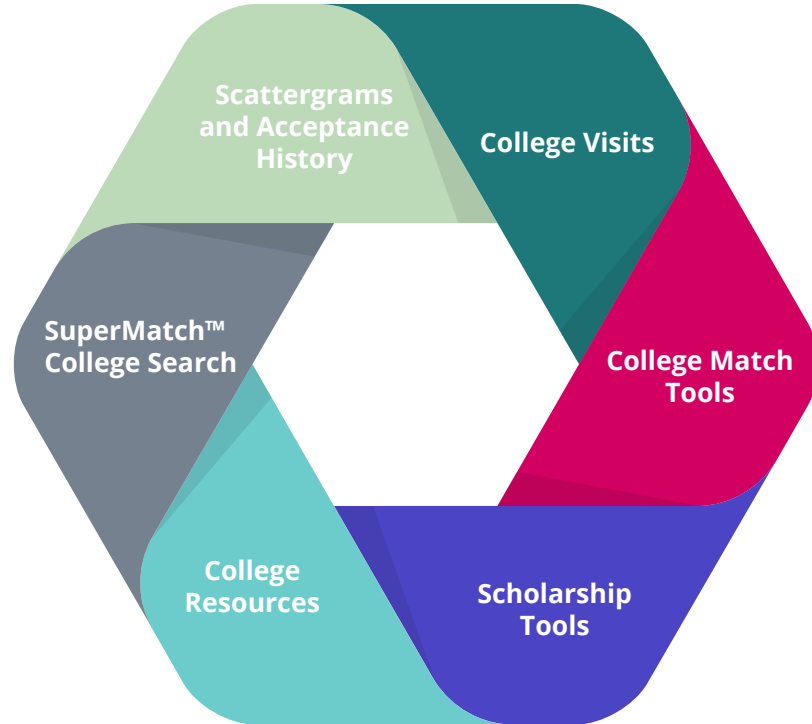
Career Key
